Subject: Who Built St Leonard's Church?

Learning Objectives	Link to National Curriculum	Resources
Learn about the roles of key characters involved in building St Leonard's Church	History: Significant historical events, people and places in their own locality. Session Preparation

- Teachers: Review the PowerPoint slides and Kahoot or other type of quiz.
- Students: Bring exercise books + writing equipment. Phones/tablets/Chromebooks to participate in a quiz

Session Outline

Introduction: 10 minutes

- Teacher to check pupils' existing knowledge of life shortly after the Norman Conquest.
- Students to discuss with partners and list 5 things that already know about everyday life in England after the Norman Conquest.
- Teacher and pupils to share answers and discuss.
- Teachers to introduce the subject of the importance of the church in medieval life and hence the building of local parish churches.

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Activity: 40 minutes

Presentation of an example of the construction of a parish church – St Leonard's Church, Flamstead – bringing to life the key players involved in its construction.

• Students might like to take it in turns to read out the texts on each slide

Independent work to answer the enquiry question: What other people do you feel were important in helping and supporting the main people? Why were they important?

Discuss and share findings.

Plenary: 10 minutes

Kahoot quiz to check and consolidate learning. Pupils use phones/tablets/Chromebooks and work in pairs or small teams.

Potential Stretch or Follow-Up

30 minutes

- Find out more about one of the main characters outlined in this lesson and create a diary entry, 'A day in the life of...'
- Find out more about the tools used by the different craftsmen. Draw images and descriptions.
