#### 12th October 2023, The Medieval Graffiti in St Leonard's Church, Flamstead.

Matt Champion, independent scholar. A report on the exciting discoveries made during his recent survey of the graffiti, and their significance.

## 13<sup>th</sup> November 2023, Swans, Bears and Ragged Staves, Badges and Battles in the Fifteenth century.

#### 15th February 2024: Bells and the Landscape of English Memory.

Mark Regan, Birmingham City University. A renowned expert on bells and bell-ringing, Mark has served as Ringing Master at Worcester Cathedral and at St Mary-le-Bow in London.

### 12<sup>th</sup> March 2024: Wall Paintings in St Leonard's Church, Flamstead, and their Wider Context.

Dr Miriam Gill, Vaughan College, Leicester. Dr Gill is an expert on medieval wall-painting, and has published on the image of the Three Living and the Three Dead in St Leonards.
